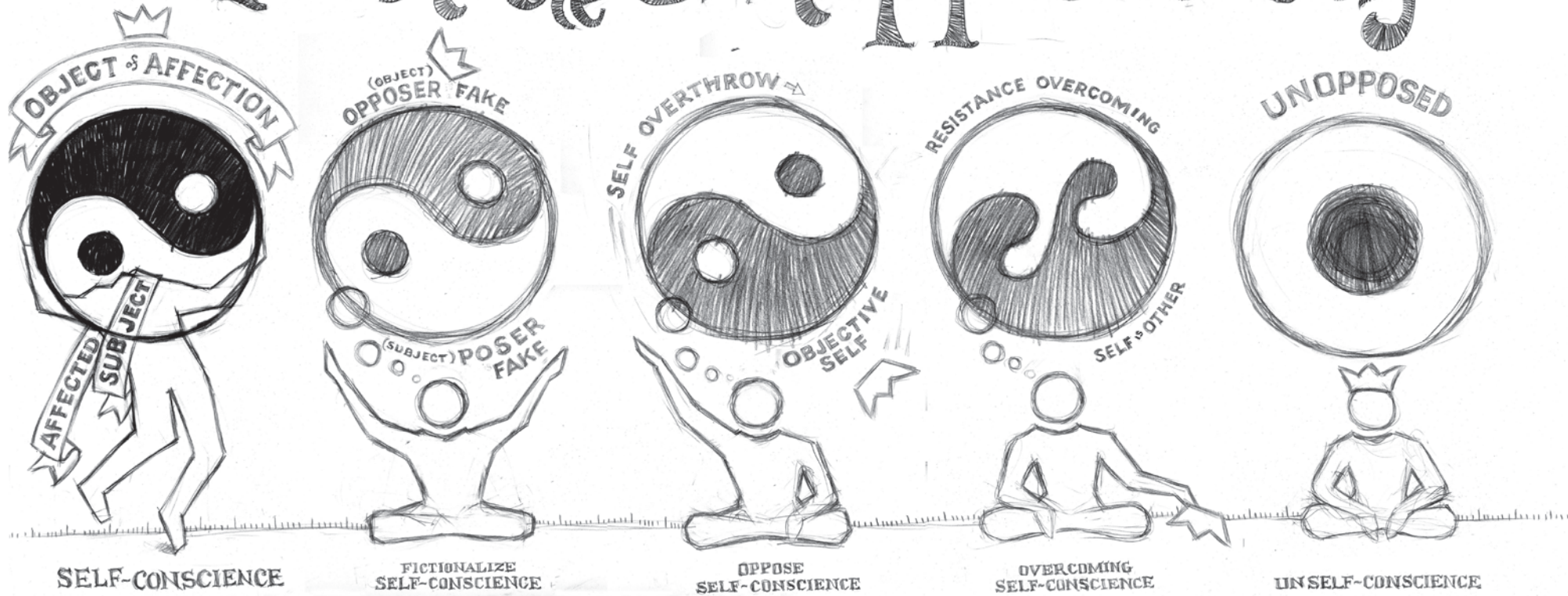


A Path to the Unopposed self



Nietzsche quotes: Ultimately, the growth of consciousness becomes a danger; ... that it is a disease.

...there is no 'being' behind doing, acting, becoming; 'the doer' is merely a fiction imposed on the doing--the doing itself is everything.

The more eyes, different eyes, we can use to observe ..., the more complete our 'concept' ..., our 'objectivity'.

Yin-Yang connotes: HUMAN CONDITION (self-opposed)

YANG • MALE • LIGHT • KNOWABLE • ACTIVE • PUSH • RECONDITION

YIN • FEMALE • DARK • MYSTERY • PASSIVE • PULL • UNCONDITION

HUMAN UNCONDITIONED (unopposed)

Other notes:

- Object = opposition throw = create opposition
- Subject = under throw = create exposure to opposition
- The self-apprehender is apprehensive
- The self-separator interferes with self-completion

- Recondition to know knowable condition = acceptance of our part and whole.
- Active reconditioning of our part and whole
- Active removal of constraints

- Uncondition to unknow unknowable condition = trust our part and whole
- The self-forgetter trusts the forgotten self
- Passive removal of constraints

- Unknow self = freedom
- Freedom = acceptance and trust
- The self-uniter comes to completion
